Worship & Arts

Ash Wednesday

Wednesday, March 1, 7:30am, 12:30pm & 6:30pm (Chapel)

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. Through the imposition of ashes, Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality.

Weekly Communion in Lent

Wednesdays, March 8-April 12, 7:30am (Chapel)

Get your morning started right with the Lord's Supper. Throughout Lent, receive communion as we focus on the Lenten theme of the cross. This is a short service (approximately 15-20 minutes) and will not include a sermon.

Lenten Hymn Sing

Sunday, March 12, 6:00pm (Chapel)

Join us for a sing-a-long as we kick off the season by singing your favorite hymns.

Palm to Passion Sunday & Parade

Sunday, April 9

This year's Palm Sunday begins with a parade through the neighborhood during the Sunday School hour. And yes, we will have a donkey! Before and after our parade, our worship will be readings and music celebrating Christ's glorious entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday through his Passion on Friday. The service opens with palm branches waving and shouts of "Hosanna" but as the story of the passion unfolds, their shouts of joy turn to demands for his crucifixion; he receives a crown of thorns as he is handed over to be mocked and killed.

Holy Thursday

Thursday, April 13, 12:00pm and 7:00pm
(Chapel)

Commemorate the day Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples and washed

their feet. Later that night, he went with them to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. The noon service will be a traditional foot washing observance. In the evening, we will experience the Last Supper with music, prayers and readings.

Community Good Friday

Friday, April 14, 12:00pm (Chapel)

In partnership with the Mid-North Church Council, North Church will host the annual Community Good Friday service of intercessory prayers for our community, nation and the world.

Good Friday – *Requiem* by Mack Wilberg

Friday, April 14, 7:00pm

The *Requiem* is written for chorus, baritone, soprano and string orchestra with horns, flutes and harp. It uses two traditional texts - "Requiem aeternam" (Latin for "eternal rest") and "Kyrie eleison" (Greek for "Lord have mercy") - along with another Latin liturgical text, "O nata lux" (O Jesus Born of Light). The remainder is in English and includes psalms

such as "I will lift up mine eyes," "How lovely is thy dwelling place" and "The Lord is my shepherd." A passage from the Gospel of John is also used: "I am the resurrection and the life." Mack Wilberg said, "A Requiem does not have to do with any specific church's dogma, I think it's associated with consolation and solace." Craig Jessop, conductor of the Mormon Tabernacle Choir who premiered the work describes the Requiem, "It's hauntingly beautiful and serene," he said. "In some ways, it compels you to leave this hustle-bustle world and lulls you into deep serenity, introspection and consolation."

Celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ with a joyful and festive worship experience. At 8:30am, we will have Holy Communion. At 11:00am, the Carolers will share special music along with music by the Cathedral Singers.
